

Schedule, Abstracts, Biodata, & Full Papers
 Schedule of the conference will be informed to the presenters by March 1, 2014.
 All accepted abstracts and brief narrative biodata of the presenters will be included in the Program Book. There will be no proceedings in the NELTA Conference.
 Full papers submitted by March 20, 2013 will be considered for publication into an edited book (with ISBN) to be issued in the same year. There will be no online version of the book chapters. Presentation
 Presenters have 30 minutes for paper presentation (including 10-minute Question & Answer session).
 In each presentation room, there is an LCD projector. Presenters are advised to use their own laptops for more convenient presentation. In case a presenter does not wish to bring his/her own laptop, please contact me so that a laptop will be made available by the committee.
 Presenters are advised to prepare clear and interesting power-point slides with minimum font size 28. The use of fancy but disturbing background should be avoided. Presenters are not allowed to grant request for a copy of soft-file in the presentation room.
 Handouts are optional (not a must). Presenters who wish to prepare handouts should use their own budget for photocopying (there is no reimbursement). There will be about 15 to 30 participants in a parallel room.
 A presenter should take turn to be a moderator for another presenter in the same parallel session. The moderator is kindly requested to open the presentation session for the presenter.
 The moderator should inform the participants that the presentation lasts for 30 minutes including time for question and answer session. In addition, he or she should remind the presenter when it is about the time to end the presentation.
