The use of storytelling in the speaking task is interesting to be discussed and

studied. Many researches have shown the result of positive impacts of storytelling

to students' speaking skill, especially for English as Foreign Language (EFL)

perception of storytelling in EFL young learners context. Thus, this research aims

to fill the gap by exploring students' perception on the use of storytelling in the
